HIV/AIDS Programme

We offered HIV Counseling and Testing (HCT) to young people age 10-24 years, PCR/DBS testing to Children 0-12 months, Children 1-5 years, SACCOs members communities. We also provided services to MARPs community. We provided both Sexual and Reproductive Health which include Sexual Transmitted Disease (STDs) and Family Planning.

Who we are

North East African Community Health Initiative (NEACHI Uganda) is a registered indigenous not-for-profit organization established in July 2020. The organization plays a major role in complimenting government development programs at national and local levels. Management

The organization is managed by a Board of Directors who are the policy makers of the organization. Others are HIV Counselors, Nurses, Health educators, Laboratory Technicians, Field Officers, Volunteers and other support staff.

Mission: To excel in providing accessible and affordable quality healthcare services to rural poor community in a sustainable manner.

Goal: To contribute to poverty reduction and improve the quality of life for young people (10 - 30 years) by increasing access to healthcare services.

- To accelerate access to services for family planning and other reproductive conditions.

NEACHI Uganda has established a Private Non for Profit Health Unit at their head office. The organization have the following clinics; NEACHI Uganda Maternity Home, Sure Medical Clinic –Manafwa, and NEACHI Uganda Health Community Medical Centre - Tororo.

The unit is put in place to help the rural communities' access quality medical care at affordable cost. It operates from Monday to Sunday 24 hours, with well experienced and qualified staffs. Malaria, HIV-TB, family planning, SRH, and livelihoods are core areas of works.

- Diagnosis and treatment
- Capacity building training and research
